Our return to play was in full swing in Fall 2022, with the schools lifting COVID restrictions earlier in 2022 (e.g., facemasks optional for players). Division Play returned to pre-pandemic format (10-week season with a full EOS schedule). No change to the division structure happened this year (where we were still somewhat limited by school gym availability (and D4 and D11 remained 6-team divisions), but the 1st floor at Howe was made into a more usable space with the purchase of additional equipment to outfit a volleyball court. Working closely with the schools during the off-season, our Spring season completed with minimal interruption to our planned schedule (no preemption of games with only some minor adjustments of match times needed).

Because of facility availability with planned school closures for summer 2023, we are unable to offer summer Division Play going into the new 2023-2024 year.

This season offered continued opportunities for Gotham to expand and maintain a program that is unique to our organization, our Power Training program. Through our adult volleyball training classes and clinics, our team sought to meet the needs of players at all levels of play seeking to improve their individual skills with the help of our excellent coaching staff. In service of our mission statement, the Training team remained committed to offering training opportunities to members throughout our community, regardless of level, background, or experience.

The Fall '22 season included the return of all of our Individual Power classes (A-E, W, and PowerPlay), and saw the transition of Power W2 from a Clinic Series to a full-length class, providing more opportunities for Beginner to Intermediate players looking to play on a women's height net. For team training, our Team Power programs provided opportunities for teams at multiple levels looking to prepare for upcoming NAGVA tournaments. In addition to our standard class offerings, we were able to offer a number of clinics and clinic series that catered to all levels of play, including additional beginner classes and a team–based series. Programming in the Spring '23 season was largely reflective of the Fall season.

All of these programs were organized by our Training Leadership Team, consisting of VP of Training Blake Rogers and Power Director Leah Hughey, and were led by a lineup of new and returning coaches who worked hard to ensure that our classes gave players the opportunity to better their skills in a supportive, community-building atmosphere.

The Training Team is excited to continue providing new opportunities for Gotham's members to take to the court more knowledgeably and confidently than they were when they started.

TOURNAMENTS & OPEN PLAY LEADERSHIP GROUP

Tournaments & Open Play saw another successful year of programming. Continuing with momentum from prior years of success, the T&OP LG sought to keep most things about the programs consistent, while acknowledging the need to make a small handful of tweaks:

The color-key system for Open Play eligibility, and Rock-Paper-Scissors system for Friendship Tournament eligibility were sunsetted after hearing feedback that they fell short in user-friendliness in communicating eligibility. These structures also did not accommodate the addition of eligibility levels that needed to happen within both programs. Following that decision, Open Plays would instead be named by the actual Division and Power designations; and Friendship Tournaments would be named by general skill classification.

On the Friendship Tournament side, an additional level was added to the eligibility tiers to help distribute demand, while creating a more consistent skill level within each group. Aside from general Friendship Tournaments offered on a weekly cadence, we celebrated seeing continued success with the Fire Island, Spring Fling, Gotham Cares, and Mix3r Tournaments, along with the return of the beloved Drag Tournament.

One of the most notable changes within the Open Play program was the discontinuation of the waitlist. With the implementation of League Apps, the steps that our volunteers needed to perform to maintain the waitlist actually increased, and the Leadership Group decided that this was not feasible to sustain. The group also considered that if a more automated system could be utilized, then it would reconsider the reintroduction of the feature. Additionally, within the Open Play program, similar to a change made within the Division Play program, the opportunity to GLOD (serve as "Gotham Leader on Duty") was opened up to current captains. This created a larger pool of leaders who could run an open play, helping to spread out the work. The decision was also made to reduce the number of GLOD's running an Open Play from 2 to 1.
